

# Briefs from the June 25, 2018 Meeting of the College Council

## **Hot Topics**

- **Blackboard** Dr. Flaherty mentioned that the College Council materials on Blackboard cannot be viewed on mobile devices and the links to the College Council page are not linking to correct page. He was not sure if it was related to the website relaunch. He informed Mike Garrity and Humberto Espino. We will look into the links and get them corrected.
- Website Mike Garrity received a small number of people with inquiries about pages that did not move over or could not be found. Overall positive feedback. One issue was with Google and the old urls, but all the urls have been updated. Reminder to update old bookmarks with the new links. New directory is great with more search options, however it does not list the department. Mike Garrity is aware of the issue, Human Resources has a new tool and they need to verify the department information, we will check on the status with Human Resources and offer assistance.
- Fall Enrollment President Moore provided information on the strategy on Fall Enrollment. The Admissions & Enrollment Services has outlined activities for the various markets prospectus students, applicants, currently enrolled, and previous enrolled students with Admissions as a priority for Fall. As of June, 20% of students are enrolled ready for Fall, which is only 8 weeks away.

### **Operational Assembly**

• Mike Garrity reported that no meetings are held in June or July. Concluded the fiscal year and sent the operational assessment to Pamela Perry. Schedule is set for FY19 and reminded Council that Operational Assembly will be meet the first week of the month. They will review membership at the first meeting.

#### Academic Senate

 Michael Flaherty reported the Senate did not meet in June. Student Support Committee asked Aja Gorham to Chair and she has accepted. Bob Greenwald resigned his Senate seat so Aja could join Senate. The Senate starts up again in August and they meet the second Tuesday of the month, except in October (3<sup>rd</sup> week) and no meeting in January. Dr. Flaherty informed Senate and College Council he will be off campus until August and his responses may be delayed while he is out.

## **Student Success**

• Shelley Tiwari and Kurian Tharakunnel presented the graduate success survey results from FY 17. The report combines the previous Graduate Student Survey and the National Clearinghouse data. Reporting on three categories - recent, one year and five year out graduates. Kurian Tharakunnel mentioned that the next report will have additional information and we will able to access the employment information due to ICCB information that will be included. You can find a copy of the full report on the Research area of the Employee Portal and Shelley has posted a copy on College Council Blackboard.

#### **Old Business**

• **College Council Survey Report** – Overall positive data, Pamela Perry opened up to comments from College Council and shared related themes, social connections with colleagues, panel discussions/forums on specific topics and specific communication/message to groups. Pamela recommends that Council familiarize themselves with the comments in the report for the upcoming retreat.

#### **New Business**

- **Coworker Connect Survey Results** Pamela Perry shared the survey results on the program started by the President's Cabinet to improve campus communications and trust. The program began with 38 participants and 37 participated in the survey with overwhelming positive results. 97% said it was worth their time. President's Cabinet suggests that College Council take over the program going forward to expand the program and see how it progresses for the next year. President Moore asked College Council to think about it and we will discuss at the July retreat.
- Criterion Team Recommendations Progress President Moore shared that the progress reporting were sent with the meeting materials. Report groupings includes status reports in progress, revisit and completed. We welcome input from College Council and ask that updates be sent to Pamela Perry.
