#### Awards:

*\$23,000 (approx.)* - Illinois Science and Energy Innovation Foundation (ISEIF) Smart Grid Consumer Education Program. Continued funding allows Triton to purchase Smart Grid equipment and host Smart Gridrelated outreach events on campus.

#### *\$6,000* - OCCRL/ICCB Pathways to Results Project.

Funding will allow Triton College to assemble a meaningful plan for implementing an evidence-based improvement that addresses documented gaps in students' equitable outcomes in the area of secondary to postsecondary transition.
