- •Description: The program assists in efforts to significantly increase the numbers of students matriculating into and successfully completing high quality degree programs in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) disciplines in order to diversify the STEM workforce or racial and ethnic groups historically underrepresented in STEM disciplines.

Grant News:

\$397,803 – Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education. The Federal grant is administered by the ICCB. Starting in FY17, Perkins funding levels will be based upon an institution's CTE Pell count and not the college's total Pell count as in previous years. FY17 Perkins funds will allow Triton to improve Career and Technical Education programs to facilitate the academic achievement of CTE students.

Under the new **Uniform Guidance and GATA Regulations,** Triton College is required to complete a Programmatic Risk Assessment for each state grant prior to receiving a new grant award. In FY17, risk assessments will be implemented and performed by state funding agencies as a final requirement for grant awards. For those of you who manage grants, please contact the Grants Development Office or your Grant Accountant if you receive a risk assessment. In the fall, The GDO will host a workshop on the new regulations.
