*\$5,000 – ICCB Career Pathways Enhancement Grant*The funds will be used to increase the number of Adult Education students successfully transitioning into Health careers.

\$15,590 - ICCB Leadership Supplemental Grant

10,000 – ICCB Special Populations Support GrantThe funds will be used to increase completion rates for special population (males in a non-traditional field) pursuing health programs.
