#### **GRANT WRITING TIP**

The Grant Development Office builds in approximately one month of lead time for each grant to complete the internal review process. As you are considering pursuing an opportunity, give yourself enough lead time to complete a draft, get feedback from colleagues, and then look at the grant again yourself with a fresh eye.

#### **GATA Requirement**

Per the Illinois Grant Accountability and Transparency Act (GATA), Federal and State agencies will now designate grantees as low, medium or high risk, which can include additional oversight on grant projects or hurt a grantee's chance to obtain funding. Risk factors that contribute to a high risk status include late reporting, poor project outcomes, mismanagement of funds and other factors. Triton's designation will be listed in the Notice of Award for all state grants.
