The award of \$650,000 will support the project entitled "Geo-Engineering Innovations through Undergraduate Scholarship (GENIUS)." Approximately, \$394,000 of this grant award will directly support Triton student scholarships. The project will also support undergraduate research, faculty mentoring and other summer enrichment activities.
