- ❖ Grant Writing Tip: Even though not all grants require applicants to include logic models in their applications, it's a good idea to use the model as a guide when developing grant projects. Logic models can help to ensure that you have clearly defined goals, measureable outcomes, activities to produce those outcomes, an evaluation plan, and the resources necessary for the project to succeed.
