- ❖ **Grant Tip:** A grant evaluation plan tells funders how you will track project activities, measure your results, and determine whether you are meeting your stated objectives. Ask yourself these questions when creating the evaluation plan: 1) What will be measured? 2) What is the baseline from which change is measured? 3) What information will be collected, when, and by whom? and 4) How will the data be analyzed?
- ❖ **Grant Compliance Tip:** In preparation for the end of the fiscal year, please ensure time & effort sheets are submitted to the respective grant accountant in a timely manner. **All grant funded positions require a time & effort sheet to be completed.** If you have any questions, please contact your grant accountant or the GDO.
