- Project Title: Childcare Access Means Parents in School (CCAMPIS) •Funder: US Department of Education, Office of Postsecondary
- Education
- •Description: This program supports existing or new campus-based childcare programs primarily serving the needs of low-income students enrolled in an institution of higher education. CCAMPIS Program funds may be used either to directly provide childcare services or contract for the provision of child care services. Fundable activities offer flexible and affordable childcare arrangements such as subsidizing childcare costs for low-income, Pell-eligible students and providing childcare services before and/or after school.

- •Project Title: Perkins Innovation and Modernization Grant
- •Funder: Department of Education
- •Description: The intent of this Perkins V program is to identify, support, and rigorously evaluate new evidence-based and innovative strategies that improve and modernize career and technical education (CTE) and better prepare students for success in the labor market. Funds under this grant can be used for a variety of activities, including designing and implementing courses or programs of study aligned to labor market needs in new or emerging fields; working with industry to upgrade equipment, technology, and related curriculum used in CTE programs; and professional development for CTE instructors, administrators, career guidance and academic counselors, and paraprofessionals.

- •Funder: US Department of Agriculture, National
- Institute of Food and Agriculture
- Description: This program includes two relevant focus areas: 1) Professional Development for Agricultural Literacy funds projects that help K-14 educators integrate food and agricultural science concepts in their classes; explore available opportunities in food and agricultural science career paths; and/or forge mentorships with professional and business leaders; 2) Agricultural Workforce Training funds curriculum development at two-year campuses aimed at expanding job-based, experiential learning opportunities for students.
