Federal

- **Project Title:** Food and Agriculture Service Learning Program
- **Funder:** USDA, National Institutes of Food and Agriculture
- **Description:** Food and Agriculture Service Learning Programs are intended to increase the capacity for food, garden, and nutrition education while fostering higher levels of community engagement between farms and school systems. The initiative is part of a broader effort to not only increase access to school meals for low-income individuals, but also to dramatically improve their quality. Activities may include expanding experiential or agriculture-based learning opportunities, such as the creation of school gardens, support to ag/food clubs, or increased exposure to on-farm activities.

- **Project Title:** Student Computer Forensics and Digital Evidence Educational Opportunities Program
- **Funder:** Bureau of Justice Assistance
- **Description:** This program is designed to enhance the capacities of institutions of higher education to better serve undergraduate and graduate students in the areas of computer forensics and digital evidence. Activities may include expanding or enhancing curriculum, providing access to learning via web-based tools, and increasing opportunities for experiential learning through internships and cooperative work study.

- **Project Title:** Digital Humanities Advancement Grants
- **Funder:** National Endowment for the Humanities
- **Description:** These grants fund scholarly research, teaching, and public programming in the humanities. Projects may involve creating or enhancing experimental, computationally-based methods, techniques, or infrastructure that contribute to the humanities; pursuing scholarship that examines the history, criticism, and philosophy of digital culture and its impact on society; or conducting evaluative studies that investigate the practices and the impact of digital scholarship on research, pedagogy, scholarly communication, and public engagement.

Foundation

- **Project Title:** Responsive Grants – Direct Service
- **Funder:** Retirement Research Foundation
- **Description:** This program funds projects that: 1) Increase the availability and effectiveness of comprehensive community programs designed to maintain older persons in their homes; 2) Provide supportive services to older persons in residential settings, such as congregate living facilities, group homes, and assisted living facilities; 3) Improve the quality of nursing home care; 4) Coordinate the provision of acute- and long-term care for older persons with chronic conditions by supporting efforts that provide continuity of care, prevention, early intervention, and client education; and 5) Provide new and expanded opportunities for older adults to engage in meaningful roles in society such as employment and volunteerism.

- **Project Title:** Diversity and Inclusiveness Funding
- **Funder:** American Philosophical Association
- **Description:** The American Philosophical Association will award up to \$20,000 in fiscal year 2020 for projects aiming to increase the presence and participation of women, racial and ethnic minorities, LGBTQ+ people, people with disabilities, people of low socioeconomic status, and other underrepresented groups at all levels of philosophy. The APA board of officers strongly prefers proposals that convincingly demonstrate their potential to decisively impact diversity and inclusion within philosophy.

Grant Writing Tip:

An effective problem or need statement guides proposal development and keeps it on the right track. When defining the problem or need, ask yourself the following questions:

- What is the situation motivating you to take action?
- Who or what is being affected and how?
- Why does the situation matter?
- What will happen if no action is taken?
- What caused the situation to arise?
