Congratulations to the following Grants Warriors for their recent awards!

- * Antigone Sharris was awarded a \$5,000 grant from the Nicor Gas Foundation. The grant will support the GADgET and GLoW summer camp programs.
- * Debbie Baness King and Rachael Giovenco received another year of funding from the Corporation for National and Community Service and the Illinois Department of Public Health. The **\$179,131 grant** will support Triton's AmeriCorps volunteers program, which provides mentoring, coaching, and tutoring to low-income students.
- Paul Jensen and Jacqueline Gordon were awarded \$15,895 from the Illinois Board of Higher Education. The funding will support Triton's Cooperative Work Study program, which places students in paid internships with local businesses.
- Jacqueline Lynch and her team in Adult Education received \$75,000 from the Illinois Community College Board's Innovative Bridge and Transitions Program. The funding will augment Triton's "CareeReady" program with additional instruction to help students prepare for the TOEFL iBT test and improve their business English speaking and writing skills.
