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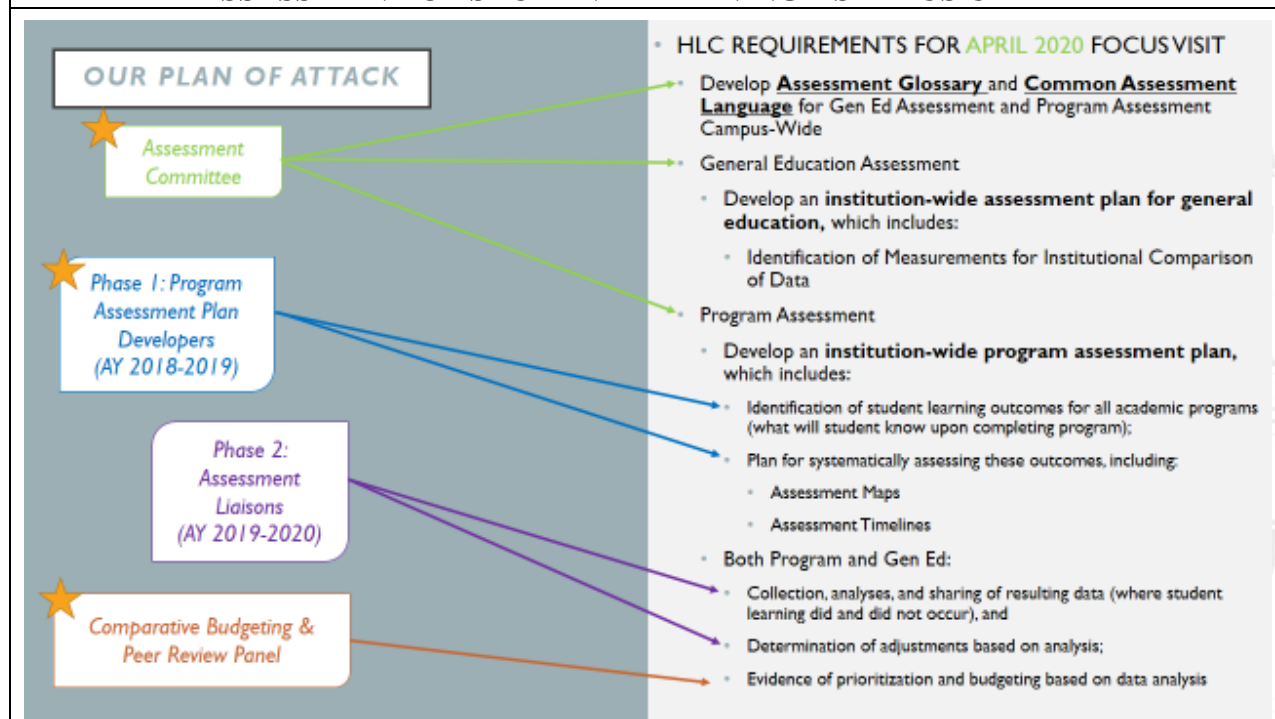


Chairman's Report

ASSESSMENT OF STUDENT LEARNING – STATUS UPDATE



Faculty members Lauren Kosrow and Christopher Clem updated the Board on progress related to the college's initiative to prepare for the HLC April 2020 Focus Visit on Assessment of Student Learning. Highlights included that a roadmap has been developed to implement a structure for student learning outcomes assessment at the program and general education level, student learning outcomes have been created for all active programs, and students will be involved in the work of outcomes. Next steps include identifying Assessment Liaisons, training through an expanded Assessment Institute, and evaluating assessment results.
